

Frequently Asked Questions

How far is Lethangie from the main site?

Lethangie campsite is roughly one mile away from T in the Park. If you drive the site is only a few minutes, on foot c. 20-25 minutes. After a long day at T in The Park it seems an awful lot longer so we suggest using our shuttle bus service (more information below).

Where is Lethangie?

Lethangie is situated between Kinross and the village of Milnathort.

Enter Kinross on the M90 Junction 6.

Take the first left along the A922 and follow the road until the end.

Turn left towards Milnathort, along the Muirs.

Look out for the Loch Leven Health and Leisure Centre. Lethangie Campsite is the next turning on the right. If in doubt please see the map on the website.

Do you have showers?

No. However there are local facilities available, the Kinross leisure centre which is about 200 yards from the campsite entrance & the Kinross Rugby Club which is about 0.75 miles from campsite entrance.

What facilities do you have?

We have plumbed in portaloos (not to be confused with standalone chemical loos), with running water and are staffed 24hrs throughout the weekend.

The Kinross Rotary provide onsite catering, including bacon rolls, sausage rolls, teas & coffees. All their proceeds generated are donated to charity. We also separately donate to the Rotary and other local charities a percentage of the proceeds from the weekend. Commercial caterers also provide catering 24hrs a day throughout the weekend.

Is there car parking?

There is a fixed charge Per Car for parking, payable on arrival (you will receive a parking ticket which will allow continued access throughout the weekend – (weather permitting)).

The charge for parking a car at the campsite is a flat rate of **£20** per car (regardless of how many people are in it). Any car entering the campsite will be charged regardless of how long the car is parked, **we strongly suggest anyone being dropped off informs the driver to drop you at the campsite entrance, and does not enter the site.** Please do not enter the campsite unless you plan to stay with us. Cars can only be parked in the car park, for health and safety reasons. There is ample car parking spaces if people park considerately. If 1400 people each decide to bring one car each some will have to use the surrounding public roads.

Does my booking with Lethangie campsite provide access to T in the Park Campsite?

No. You will require a separate camping ticket (weekend pass) to enter the campsite at T in the Park.

I am camping at T in the park, am I allowed to enter Lethangie?

Only those with a valid ticket to Lethangie Campsite will be allowed entry.

Can I bring friends into the campsite who may only be staying a few hours?

No. Lethangie Campsite ticket holders are the only people allowed into the campsite. If you have friends who you wish to meet, or are being dropped off / collected, please suggest you meet at the campsite entrance (All vehicles entering the campsite will be charged a car parking fee (regardless of how long you are parking), please do not enter the campsite unless you plan to stay with us.

CARAVANS

Do we supply Caravans?

No, we do not supply caravans on the site.

Can I use an awning?

Yes – as long as they don't take up a huge amount of room (ie if the awning is larger than the size of the caravan then it's too big).

Can I pitch tents around the caravan?

No - In previous years this has been possible, however due to strict fire regulations campers are not allowed to continue this practice.

May I use a generator?

Yes – All those wishing to use a generator must inform campsite upon entry – each generator needs to be registered and someone onsite will direct you towards the correct location & recommendations for use (To comply with our strict fire control policy).

Refuelling any generator requires a campsite employee to be notified and to be in attendance.

We kindly ask all generators are turned off at 3am and should not be restarted until 8am.

Failure to comply will result in the campsite refusing permission to use the generator for the entire weekend – Further non compliance and the campsite owner will withdraw permission to stay at Lethangie and you will be asked to leave.

While the above may seem overly restrictive these conditions form our license requirements and as such we need to comply.

Is electricity included in the cost of my booking?

Do you have any hook up points?

Yes, however they are fully booked - they are generally booked one year in advance.

Can I park my car next to the caravan?

No – all cars must be parked in the car park. All cars are charged a parking fee (see car parking charges).

Do you provide chemical loo disposal?

Do you have fresh running water?

CAMPING

Do you supply tents?

Can I set up a marquee?

Can I have a gazebo?

Yes

We will charge £20 per gazebo payable when the stewards come round throughout the weekend. Gazebos without a valid ticket will be dismantled. Please advise us of your intentions before you assemble the equivalent of the O2 dome. Last year we paid for 25 to be disposed of at a considerable cost. They also reduce the space for everyone else.

Are we allowed glass bottles?

Cattle graze on this land so we don't want broken glass in the field. Please clean up all rubbish placing it in black bags provided free of charge and then place them in the potato crates. Please place glass bottles in the recycling facilities provided; this year we have increased the number of recycling points.

Can we have a barbeque?

Yes – Disposable Barbeques are acceptable – large barbeques are not permitted.

Can we have a bonfire?

No – you are in a campsite, the safety of others is paramount - failure to comply will be met with the campsite owner asking you to leave.

Can we set off fireworks?

As above.

Can we play music?

Yes – as long as you respect the other campers and do not cause too much noise.

Can we play amplified music (either in your car or in campsite)?

No – we have neighbours, and fellow campers who should be respected - failure to comply will result in the campsite owner asking you to leave.

Do you have a left luggage area?

No, we suggest you do not leave any valuables in your tent - all valuables should be locked in your car or kept in your possession, we take no responsibility for your valuables on the campsite, in the car park or in your possession.

What time do you close?

We ask everyone to leave the campsite by midday on the Monday after T in the Park.

Where can I park?

There is parking available within the campsite away from the camping area – you will be directed to the parking area when you arrive.

Where do the Shuttle-buses depart?

The middle of the campsite, in-between the caravan and tent area. See highlighted area on the site plan on the website.

How often do the shuttle-buses depart?

They will run continually throughout the weekend – there is no set timing, they will run as often as possible and there are more at peak times.

Is there a charge for the shuttle-buses?

There is an approximate charge of **£2** per person per journey for the shuttle buses this year due to running costs being higher for the coach company.

I have a disability, is there alternative transport other than the shuttle bus?

We can arrange for suitable alternative transport but please inform us at time of booking if this is required.

How do I walk to T in the Park?

Turn left at the campsite entrance heading towards Kinross – 300 yards along the road you will see the leisure centre – enter the leisure centre car park and walk along the pavement to the side of the leisure centre – continue to walk along this pavement (for approx 4 minutes) until you reach Gallowhill Road – turn right, and you will see the Bridge which takes you across the M90 – continue along this road and follow the pedestrian walkway to T in the Park.

What happens if we lose any property?

All lost property that is handed in will be looked after at the campsite entrance – if the property is not claimed all items will be forwarded to the Kinross Police Station.

What happens if the T in the Park event is cancelled?

The campsite will be open regardless of T in the Park and refunds will be only made where the campsite is at fault for being unable to stage the accommodation. The campsite hires expensive facilities for the weekend that can't be refunded and are paid for months in advance.

Where to camp?

Different fields have different atmospheres. For example, the Big field as identified on the site plan on the website is a popular, lively spot. It has a culture of its own with people returning year on year. Alternatively, the Quiet Area camping zone is just that and we would encourage you to respect the fact that those choosing to camp here want peace and quiet.

Some camping fields are very busy and fill up quickly but there is usually more camping space to the east of the site in the New field.

- Campsite stewards have a base in every camping field. Check out where the nearest one is to you. They can direct and advise you, and are first port of call in an emergency - be it a medical or security issue.
- It is worth noting where you camp in relation to a numbered Fire Point or other fixed point, or clearly marking your pitch with a flag. It can be a nightmare to find your tent without a recognisable landmark.
- Please do not take up too much space when setting up camp.
- Say hello to your neighbours to build a community feeling and provide greater security. Look after each other and if someone is feeling ill, get help.
- Remember that tents are very vulnerable, even zipped up. Padlocks scream "I have something worth nicking in here".
- If you're worried about something being stolen, don't leave it in your tent. Postcode your valuables. UV pens are available at Property Lock-ups.
- Bear in mind that the most commonly lost items in the camping fields are keys, wallets, phones and cameras. Please keep them safe!
- Be inventive about hiding your money - and don't keep it all in one place.

No sleeping in cars - The event's licence conditions prohibit sleeping in cars.
